



## REGULATION OF QFI THESIS FROM COHORT 2020/21 AND STARTING FROM GRADUATION SESSION JULY 2022

- .1. The maximum score assigned to the theses is 7 points; up to 5 points there is no need for a co-supervisor, to give 6 or 7 points you need a co-supervisor (see QFI Regulation 20/21)
- .2. A bonus is planned for those who graduate on time: 5 points for those who graduate in the July session, 4 points for those who graduate in the November session, 3 points for those who graduate in the March session (see QFI 20 Regulations / 21)
- .3. The student in general is not guaranteed to choose neither supervisor nor topic of the thesis
- .4. To help the student in finding a supervisor and a topic, on the QFI website there is a Google Form that reports both supervisors and thesis topics from the last few years; the student is encouraged to ask teachers who do not have many undergraduates to supervise
- .5. As a rule, the student should ask the teacher to supervise him/her about 6 months before the session in which he/she wants to graduate and with a number of remaining credits not exceeding 20. On the other side, the student cannot ask the teacher to supervise him/her before 9 months with respect to the session in which he/she intends to graduate.
- .6. When the supervisor assigns the thesis, the student commits to graduate in the session initially scheduled; it is possible to postpone the graduation up to 2 sessions; if the student does not graduate by the second session after the session initially scheduled, he/she will have to look for another supervisor (unless the teacher agrees to continue being the supervisor)
- .7. Students commit to deliver the final version of the thesis within 30 days from the deadline for uploading the thesis online. The supervisor commits to provide feedback to the student in reasonable terms, from the delivery of the different chapters or of the thesis as a whole, in order not to hinder the fulfillment of the 30-day limit.
- .8. It is advisable to ask to be supervised by the teachers of the courses that the student has in the career plan (exceptions to this rule are possible only if the teacher agrees)
